Welcome to the Michigan State University College of Human Medicine. We are looking forward to meeting you on Monday, August 8, 2022. We hope you are ready to begin this very exciting chapter of your medical education journey. This message includes information for the first day of orientation on Monday, August 8, 2022, and other advance information regarding the 2022 Prematriculation and Orientation Program. **Please read this carefully.**

### **Overview of Prematriculation and Orientation Schedule**

Attached to this mailing is the 2022 Prematriculation and Orientation Program Schedule Overview. You will receive a more detailed schedule when you arrive on Monday, August 8, 2022. You will note that there are two days when the entire entering class will be on the East Lansing campus (Monday, August 8<sup>th</sup> and Monday, August 15<sup>th</sup>). Other days programming will be scheduled in your respective campus, broadcast across campuses, or presented using a zoom format. There are large sessions as well as smaller rotational settings.

You are required to attend all sessions. There are sessions that will begin as early as 7:50 a.m. and there are sessions that will end as late as 8:00 p.m. throughout the two weeks of orientation. There are no required sessions on the following weekend days: Saturday, August 13, Sunday, August 14, and Sunday, August 21. There are evening sessions on Tuesday, August 9; Wednesday, August 10; Thursday, August 11<sup>th</sup>; Monday, August 15<sup>th</sup>; Tuesday, August 16<sup>th</sup>; and Thursday, August 18<sup>th</sup>. The Matriculation and White Coat Ceremony for the 2022 Entering Class will be held on Saturday, August 20, 2022, at 5:00 p.m. at DeVos Performance Hall in Grand Rapids. This is the ceremony for the entire class so East Lansing campus students and their families will have to travel to Grand Rapids for this event. Please plan accordingly – no transportation is provided.

### **Arrival Time and Location for Monday, August 8<sup>th</sup>**

All 2022 College of Human Medicine Entering Students will be together in East Lansing on Monday, August 8, 2022. The students assigned to the Grand Rapids campus will be traveling via bus to the East Lansing campus. **All medical students will check in at 9:45 a.m. on Monday, August 8, 2022, in A133 in the Life Science Building.**

### **Parking on the East Lansing Campus on Monday, August 8<sup>th</sup>, and the Remainder of the Prematriculation and Orientation Program**

The College of Human Medicine East Lansing Campus is located at Michigan State University. Entering students are asked to **park in Parking Lot 91** located at the intersection of Service Road and Hagadorn Road. **This lot is free to medical students during the Prematriculation and Orientation Program (8/8 -8/30/22).** Please see attached map. Service Road runs between Harrison Road (to the west) and Hagadorn Road (to the east). The entrance to Parking Lot 91 is on Service Road. You can enter traveling from either direction. Also, you cannot turn left directly onto Service Road traveling north on Hagadorn. You have to pass Service Road, then do a U-turn at the turn area to your left, head south on Hagadorn Road and then make a right turn onto Service Road. There is not a problem if you are traveling south on Hagadorn Road or if you are traveling down Service Road heading east. Please allow yourself plenty of time if you are not familiar with the area. You may want to drive to campus the weekend before orientation so that you are clear about the location of Parking Lot 91 as well as the Life Science Building. Michigan State University is very strict about parking, so please follow these guidelines.

On Monday, August 8<sup>th</sup>, the program will be held in the Life Sciences Building. The attached map shows you where Parking Lot 91 is located and has walking arrows that will direct you to the entrance of the Life Science Building. When you exit Lot 91, you will walk west along Service Road to Bogue Street. The Life Science Building is located on Bogue Street and is clearly marked on the attached map. Please see attached map for walking directions. Please allow at least 15 minutes to walk from Parking Lot 91 to the Life Science Building.

### **Monday, August 8<sup>th</sup>, Student Check In at 9:45 a.m.**

All 2022 Entering Students will check-in at 9:45 a.m. in A133 in the Life Science Building to pick up informational packets, drawstring sinch sacks, name tags, and other materials. The formal program will begin promptly at 10:00 a.m. Lunch, afternoon snacks, and water will be provided. Please see a simple outline of the program for Monday noted below.

### **Laptops/Internet Accessibility**

There are sessions during the Prematriculation and Orientation program that will be completed remotely via zoom. Each individual entering student will be responsible for having a laptop and internet access to attend these sessions remotely via zoom. **The sessions shaded green on the attached 2022 Prematriculation and Orientation Schedule Overview are the sessions completed remotely** during the Prematriculation and Orientation Program. There are some sessions presented remotely via zoom on Tuesday, August 9<sup>th</sup>; Wednesday, August 10<sup>th</sup>; Thursday, August 11<sup>th</sup>; Thursday, August 18<sup>th</sup> and Friday, August 19<sup>th</sup>. On each of those days there will be a mixture of programming in person and programming via zoom, see the schedule for further details.

### **One Book Community Read**

To foster greater inclusivity and promote discussion of the social determinants of health, the College of Human Medicine Council on Diversity Education (CODE) has recommended that the students in the entering class, the Shared Discovery Curriculum leadership, college administrators, and educational leaders throughout the curriculum be asked to read a single book as a “Community Read”. The book that has been selected is **“What the Eyes Don’t See: A Story of Crisis, Resistance, and Hope in an American City”** by Dr. Mona Hanna-Attisha. This book invokes major themes of health equity, structural racism, and advocacy. There will be opportunities for small group discussions and large group programs scheduled during orientation and in the early fall for a college conversation about this reading.

**Each entering student will be receiving an individual email with a one-time use link and directions on how to access their complimentary digital copy of the eBook “What the Eyes Don’t See” by Dr. Mona Hanna- Attisha in the upcoming week.** Each student is expected to read and be ready for a discussion on the book during the Prematriculation and Orientation Program on Monday, August 15, 2022. Once you receive your link to your copy of the eBook, please redeem the eBook and start reading immediately.

### **Prematriculation and Orientation Attire**

All 2022 Entering Students are welcome to wear casual attire throughout the Prematriculation and Orientation Program. You will be walking to and between buildings, sitting in classrooms and labs most days. Casual Attire is classified as jeans, slacks, modest shorts, capris, shirts, and tops. Dress appropriate for the weather each day so that you are comfortable and prepared for a full day of activities. You will be meeting many administrators, faculty, and staff throughout the two weeks.

No formal pictures will be taken on the first day. However, on Tuesday, August 9<sup>th</sup>, Grand Rapids Campus students will be taking a professional photograph. This photograph will be incorporated into a slide show for the Matriculation and White Coat Ceremony on August 20<sup>th</sup>, included in the Class Viewbook which will be distributed on August 20<sup>th</sup>, and will be used for other official college programs that require a student photograph. For this photo, we encourage

you to wear business attire. The photo will be head and shoulder shot. Solid colors usually work best. Consider collared shirts (no t-shirts), modest blouses, jackets and ties are optional.

For the Orientation for Gross Anatomy Lab on Thursday, August 18<sup>th</sup>, closed toed shoes are required.

The Matriculation and White Coat ceremony on Saturday, August 20<sup>th</sup> is a formal program. Professional Business Attire is expected (Dress slacks, dress shoes, collared shirt with tie, modest blouses, skirts, dresses).

The **Phonetic Name Pronunciation** information is used to assist the faculty/staff with the correct pronunciation of student names at College of Human Medicine events beginning with the White Coat Ceremony at the end of the busy Pre-matriculation and Orientation program. During the White Coat Ceremony, each entering student will be introduced individually, and we want to correctly pronounce each student's name. Phonetic pronunciation permits us to say aloud a name as it sounds and not necessarily how as it looks when written. *For example: David Baranowski sounds like David Ba-ra-nof-ski.* The Qualtrics form includes additional guidelines for typing your name as it sounds. 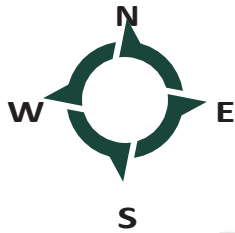
