Welcome to the Michigan State University College of Human Medicine. We are looking forward to meeting you on Monday, August 8, 2022. We hope you are ready to begin this very exciting chapter of your medical education journey. This message includes information for the first day of orientation on Monday, August 8, 2022, and other advance information regarding the 2022 Prematriculation and Orientation Program. **Please read this carefully.**

Overview of Prematriculation and Orientation Schedule

Attached to this mailing is the 2022 Prematriculation and Orientation Program Schedule Overview. You will receive a more detailed schedule when you arrive on Monday, August 8, 2022. You will note that there are two days when the entire entering class will be on the East Lansing campus (Monday, August 8th and Monday, August 15th). Other days programming will be scheduled in your respective campus, broadcast across campuses, or presented using a zoom format. There are large sessions as well as smaller rotational settings.

You are required to attend all sessions. There are sessions that will begin as early as 7:50 a.m. and there are sessions that will end as late as 8:00 p.m. throughout the two weeks of orientation. There are no required sessions on the following weekend days: Saturday, August 13, Sunday, August 14, and Sunday, August 21. There are evening sessions on Tuesday, August 9; Wednesday, August 10; Thursday, August 11th; Monday, August 15th; Tuesday, August 16th; and Thursday, August 18th. The Matriculation and White Coat Ceremony for the 2022 Entering Class will be held on Saturday, August 20, 2022, at 5:00 p.m. at DeVos Performance Hall in Grand

Rapids. This is the ceremony for the entire class so East Lansing campus students and their families will have to travel to Grand Rapids for this event.

Arrival Time at 7:45 a.m. to Board Buses on Monday, August 8th

All 2022 College of Human Medicine Entering Students will be together in East Lansing on Monday, August 8, 2022. The students assigned to the Grand Rapids campus will be traveling via bus to the East Lansing campus.

- PLEASE NOTE: There are no activities scheduled at the Secchia Center on Monday, August 8th. Students will board buses right outside of the Trowbridge Parking Lot on Monroe Ave at 7:45 a.m. for travel to the East Lansing campus at Michigan State University. Please plan accordingly.
- Medical Students at the Grand Rapids Campus are asked to park in Trowbridge Parking Lot, located at the corner of Trowbridge and Monroe, 544 Monroe Avenue NW, Grand Rapids, MI 49503.
- The entrance to the lot is on Trowbridge Street NE. The gate will be up on the first morning so you can enter. (See the attached Map).
- You will meet the buses on Monroe Avenue right outside the parking lot. The College of Human Medicine staff will be onsite to check you in at 7:45 a.m. The buses are scheduled to depart at 8:00 a.m. sharp so please arrive on time. (In case of emergency, please call Joy Skutt at 616-481-7767.)
- The buses will drop you off in front of the Life Science Building in East Lansing. You will enter the lobby to check in on site for the medical student check in at 9:45 a.m. on Monday, August 8, 2022, in A133 in the Life Science Building.
- The buses will also pick up students in front of the Life Science Building at the end of the day for the return trip to Grand Rapids.

Parking for the Grand Rapids campus on Monday, August 8th through Friday, August 19th

The College of Human Medicine Grand Rapids Campus is located at Michigan State University Secchia Center located on Michigan Street in downtown Grand Rapids. Entering students are asked to park in the Trowbridge Parking Lot, located at the corner of Trowbridge and Monroe, 544 Monroe Avenue NW, Grand Rapids, MI 49503. The college is providing complementary parking in the Trowbridge Parking Lot for entering medical students during the Prematriculation and Orientation Program (8/8 - 8/19/22). Please see attached map for the location of Trowbridge Parking Lot.

Starting on Tuesday, August 9th, please ensure you plan for walking time from the Trowbridge Parking Lot to the Secchia Center as it can take 10-12 minutes to walk to the building. You will walk down Monroe Avenue until you pass the MSU Grand Rapids Research Center. You will turn left at the corner of Monroe Avenue and Michigan Street, and then walk-up Michigan Street for a few blocks to Bostwick Street. Follow the sidewalk turning left at the light at Bostwick. Then walk straight ahead and you will enter the Secchia Center.

Monday, August 8th, Student Check In at 9:45 a.m.

All 2022 Entering Students will check-in at 9:45 a.m. in A133 in the Life Science Building in East Lansing to pick up informational packets, drawstring sinch sacks, name tags, and other materials. The formal program will begin promptly at 10:00 a.m. Lunch, afternoon snacks, and water will be provided. Please see a simple outline of the program for Monday noted below.

Laptops/Internet Accessibility

There are sessions during the Prematriculation and Orientation program that will be completed remotely via zoom. Each individual entering student will be responsible for having a laptop and internet access to attend these sessions remotely via zoom. The sessions shaded green on the attached 2022 Prematriculation and Orientation Schedule Overview are the sessions completed remotely during the Prematriculation and Orientation Program. There are some sessions presented remotely via zoom on Tuesday, August 9th; Wednesday, August 10th; Thursday, August 18th and Friday, August 19th. On each of those days there will be a mixture of programming in person and programming via zoom, see the schedule for further details.

One Book Community Read

To foster greater inclusivity and promote discussion of the social determinants of health, the College of Human Medicine Council on Diversity Education (CODE) has recommended that the students in the entering class, the Shared Discovery Curriculum leadership, college administrators, and educational leaders throughout the curriculum be asked to read a single book as a "Community Read". The book that has been selected is "What the Eyes Don't See: A Story of Crisis, Resistance, and Hope in an American City" by Dr. Mona Hanna-Attisha. This book invokes major themes of health equity, structural racism, and advocacy. There will be opportunities for small group discussions and large group programs scheduled during orientation and in the early fall for a college conversation about this reading.

Each entering student will be receiving an individual email with a one-time use link and directions on how to access their complimentary digital copy of the eBook "What the Eyes Don't See" by Dr. Mona Hanna- Attisha in the upcoming week. Each student is expected to read and be ready for a discussion on the book during the Prematriculation and Orientation Program on Monday, August 15, 2022. Once you receive your link to your copy of the eBook, please redeem the eBook and start reading immediately.

Prematriculation and Orientation Attire

All 2022 Entering Students are welcome to wear casual attire throughout the Prematriculation and Orientation Program. You will be walking to and between buildings, sitting in classrooms and labs most days. Casual Attire is classified as jeans, slacks, modest shorts, capris, shirts, and tops. Dress appropriate for the weather each day so that you are comfortable and prepared for a full day of activities. You will be meeting many administrators, faculty, and staff throughout the two weeks.

No formal pictures will be taken on the first day. However, on Tuesday, August 9th, Grand Rapids Campus students will be taking a professional photograph. This photograph will be incorporated into a slide show for the Matriculation and White Coat Ceremony on August 20th, included in the Class Viewbook which will be distributed on August 20th, and will be used for other official college programs that require a student photograph. For this photo, we encourage you to wear business attire. The photo will be head and shoulder shot. Solid colors usually work best. Consider collared shirts (no t-shirts), modest blouses, jackets and ties are optional.

For the Orientation for Gross Anatomy Lab on Thursday, August 18th, closed toed shoes are required.

The Matriculation and White Coat ceremony on Saturday, August 20th is a formal program. Professional Business Attire is expected (Dress slacks, dress shoes, collared shirt with tie, modest blouses, skirts, dresses).

The **Phonetic Name Pronunciation** information is used to assist the faculty/staff with the correct pronunciation of student names at College of Human Medicine events beginning with the White Coat Ceremony at the end of the busy Pre-matriculation and Orientation program. During the White Coat Ceremony, each entering student will be introduced individually, and we want to correctly pronounce each student's name. Phonetic pronunciation permits us to say aloud a name as it sounds and not necessarily how as it looks when written. *For example: David Baranowski sounds like David Ba-ra-nof-ski*. The Qualtrics form includes additional guidelines for typing your name as it sounds. Parking at Trowbridge Lot (544 Monroe Ave NW Grand Rapids, MI 49503)

- 1. Exit off I-196
- 2. Take right turn onto Michigan St NW
- 3. Right turn onto Monroe Ave NW
- 4. Right turn onto Trowbridge St NW
- 5. Enter Trowbridge Lot to the right

Designated Walking Route from Trowbridge Lot (544 Monroe Ave NW) to Secchia Center (15 Michigan St NE):

- 1. Walk south on Monroe Ave NW
- 2. Walk east on Michigan St NW
- 3. Take Spectrum Health, entrance 3 and walk left to roundabout. Arrive at Secchia Center.
