Health Related Information

You should have already received four previous mailings for the College of Human Medicine 2022 Entering Class sent via email, the first dated June 3, 2022, a second dated June 16, 2022, a third dated June 23, 2022, and a fourth dated June 20, 2022. You should have also received a separate email on July 6, 2022, that contained important information regarding the required photo submission for your Spartan Card (MSU ID Card). It is very important that you carefully read each mailing and review each item provided and submit all required materials in a timely fashion. If you have not read the previous mailings yet, please ensure you do so immediately. Basic Life Support Certification

Students in the 2022 Entering Class of the Michigan State University College of Human Medicine are required to complete Basic Life Support (BLS) Training for Healthcare Providers.

The Michigan State University Learning and Assessment Center (LAC) will provide the mandatory American Heart Association "Basic Life Support for Healthcare Provider" course for the 2022 Entering Class. This is a two-part course that includes an online component followed by a skills training and testing component. Skills training and testing will be conducted in person during orientation in both East Lansing and Grand Rapids. The cost for this course is \$75.00, and your certification will be valid for two years.

Please click on the link below for your assigned campus to register for the BLS course and complete "Part 1" of the training. You must complete the registration and the Part 1 online component no later than 8:00 a.m. Friday, July 22, 2022.

You will receive a certificate of completion once you complete Part 1 which you will need to print and bring with you OR show a screenshot of the certificate of completion using your smartphone when you arrive for Part 2. You will not be issued a card until both Part 1 and Part 2 are complete.

You will not be permitted to complete the "Part 2" mannequin skill testing if you do not provide evidence of your completion certificate from "Part 1."

- East Lansing Assigned Students Click this link to Register for East Lansing BLS Training
 The BLS Training "Part 2" for Entering Students assigned to the East Lansing campus will be scheduled on Thursday, August 11, 2022. Each student will receive scheduled skills assessment time and location for "Part 2" prior to the start of orientation.
- Grand Rapids Assigned Students Click this link to Register for Grand Rapids BLS Training
 The BLS Training "Part 2" for Entering Students assigned to the Grand Rapids campus will be scheduled on Tuesday, August 9, 2022. Each student will receive scheduled skills assessment time and location for "Part 2" prior to the start of orientation.

Please Note: When you register for the BLS Training, the designated time that appears on the registration link is either 8:00 am or 9:00 am. Not all students will be scheduled for training starting at 8:00 am or 9:00 am. This time is listed to enable all students on a given campus to use one registration link. You will receive notification of the specific time that you will participate in the Part 2 skills testing prior to August 8th.

If you have completed an American Heart Association "Basic Life Support for Healthcare Provider" course and are currently certified through March 2023, you may request to be excused from the course offered during orientation. Please email Mrs. Tamra Dillingham at dillin27@msu.edu as soon as possible and include a copy of the front and back of your current BLS card. She will confirm that your BLS certification meets the College of Human Medicine criteria.

Blood-borne Pathogen Training

Within the next month, you should receive a message to your MSU email from orrs.train@msu.edu. The subject line of the email will read "Training Due Within Thirty Days." You will be instructed to login to the Ability training system to complete the online module "Blood-borne Pathogen Awareness Training." Click on the link to login and select the MSU Student or Volunteer module. Although the subject line reads "due in thirty days, you are asked to complete this online training module by Friday, August 5, 2022, prior to the beginning of orientation.

Drug Screening

Our partnering hospitals and clinics require medical students to undergo drug screening before participating in any educational activities in the clinical setting. All students in the 2022 Entering Class will undergo drug screening prior to entering their assigned ECE clinics.

The College has arranged with CastleBranch to administer drug screening via urinalysis for all students in the 2022 Entering Class. Please click on the link below and follow the instructions provided on the website to create an account and place your order for the drug screen: https://portal.castlebranch.com/iw33

The cost for the drug screen is \$35 and will be collected through the CastleBranch site when you place your order. Instructions will be provided about locations for screening and how to report prescription drug use that could affect screening results.

The results of individual drug screens will be available to you and through an Administrator Portal to the College. The Assistant Dean for Student Wellness and Engagement (Dr. Brady) will be the only CHM administrator, faculty, or staff person with access to that portal.

Should a student have a positive screen, the student will be notified by CastleBranch. CastleBranch will provide medical follow up with that student to review the positive screen before any information is released to the College. Information related to a <u>confirmed</u> positive drug screen will be forwarded to the College of Human Medicine. Drug screening results are confidential and will only be shared with a small administrative group within the College of Human Medicine on a need-to-know basis.

You are strongly encouraged to complete your drug screen by Friday, August 5, 2022, to guarantee that you are cleared well in advance of your first clinic assignment. If you have any questions or concerns, please contact Dr. Judith Brady by email (<u>bradyj@msu.edu</u>) or text (517-410-3535).
